

In 2024, Conexus was honored to establish partnerships with the three organizations working to deliver better health outcomes for global communities.

Against a backdrop of significant challenges, these innovative, dedicated partners work together with local government and health experts to provide accessible community care.













PARTNER SPOTLIGHT TAIMAKA, NIGERIA

Taimaka is an NGO working to combat acute childhood malnutrition in Gombe State, Nigeria. Globally, 45.4 million children suffer from acute malnutrition, causing 3.1 million preventable deaths annually. Conexus helps fund Taimaka's cost-effective, scalable model for malnutrition treatment, which includes training community health workers and providing digital tools, therapeutic foods, and medicines. The program has achieved a 95% recovery rate and significantly reduced treatment costs. Over the next three years, they plan to expand their program to treat more children across Nigeria, treating 50,000 of the sickest children in the world.

Dr. Abubakar Umar, Co-founder and Medical Director at Taimaka, said: "Making treatment simpler, cheaper, and more accessible is saving more lives in the most vulnerable communities. Support from organizations like Conexus comes at a critical time for the families we serve as we scale up the program."



PARTNER SPOTLIGHT ANGAT BUHAY, PHILIPPINES

Conexus is supporting the Filipino charity Angat Buhay with two grants aimed at improving healthcare. The first grant funds a mental health pilot project in Naga City, addressing high rates of anxiety and depression. The initiative will train non-medical volunteers and community leaders in psychosocial support, enabling them to implement sustainable mental health programs. It aims to assist 7,500 adults and children through individual sessions, group workshops, and lectures, while developing a scalable model for wider rollout.

The second grant focuses on rehabilitating healthcare services in Naga City following Tropical Storm Kristine in October 2024. Angat Buhay is replacing medical supplies and equipment lost to flooding in 27 barangay health centers. This initiative will strengthen the capacity of these centers to provide accessible, quality healthcare, particularly benefiting remote communities


















PARTNER SPOTLIGHT VILLAGE HOPECORE INTERNATIONAL, KENYA

We partnered with Village HopeCore International to expand the Maternal Child Health Clinic program in Kenya's Tharaka South sub-county. This initiative aims to improve healthcare access for thousands of women and children, providing prenatal care, nutritional support, immunizations, and health education. By funding mobile clinics and training local health workers, the partnership addresses urgent health disparities and seeks to reduce maternal and child mortality rates.

"Partnering with Conexus MedStaff allows us to work together to address the health disparities that have long affected our communities, particularly in accessing Maternal and Child Health services," said Dr. Mutuma Njagi, Public Health Program Manager, Village HopeCore International." PARTNER SPOTLIGHT SABRE EDUCATION, GHANA

Sabre Education is a non-profit dedicated to transforming early childhood education. Sabre has been delivering sustainable and impactful early childhood education programs in Ghana for over 20 years, addressing the critical need for high-quality kindergarten education. The partnership will support Sabre's latest initiative in the La Nkwantanang Madina Municipality in Greater Accra, an area facing challenges such as high enrolment, overcrowded classrooms, and infrastructure issues. The project aims to improve classroom environments and enhance teacher training, leading to better learning outcomes for children.

By partnering with Sabre Education to implement play-based learning approaches will help create better educational foundations for thousands of children in the area.

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT FAIRPLAY FOR ALL FOUNDATION, PHILIPPINES

<u>Fairplay For All Foundation</u> supports children to access education and live healthier lives. Funding from Conexus sponsors Fairplay For All's youth scholar program, helping ensure their continued education and improving access to nutritious meals and clean water, essentials for learning and achieving academically.

Fairplay, based in Payatas, aims to level the playing field by empowering local people to break the cycle of poverty. Fairplay uses football as a universal tool to improve the wellbeing of the community. Their mission is for all children to learn, play, and grow.

Scholarship funds cover transportation to and from school, uniforms, basic school supplies, daily lunches, and provide academic, social, and emotional support to children in the education program. This holistic care helps promote good mental health and offers financial incentives, which is critical to making a positive impact in young lives.

In 2024, we were proud to deliver over 21,000 free education hours through one-on-one coaching, webinars and study programs to nurses and medical technologists around the globe, helping them gain knowledge and grow professionally. Conexus Academy delivers a personalized plan to guide progression.

Our in-house Conexus Academy educators help equip international nurses with essential skills and knowledge that not only prepare them for deployment but also enable them to make an immediate impact in their home countries. While waiting to deploy, these nurses apply their training to enhance patient care, implement advanced practices, and support underserved healthcare systems. This ripple effect strengthens global health communities, fostering improved health outcomes and sharing critical expertise worldwide.



SCHOLARSHIPS

Ten healthcare professionals were awarded scholarships in 2024 to help advance their knowledge and support excellence in healthcare. By investing in development, Conexus aims to create a future generation of leaders.

Eight registered nurses received the Education Advancement for Registered Nurses (EARN) Scholarship, which helps them pursue advanced certifications, degrees and specialized training. Additionally, the Conexus Growth and Opportunity for the Advancement of Laboratorians (GOAL) Scholarship, designed to advance expertise in laboratory science, awarded two medical laboratory scientists funds.

All our scholarship recipients demonstrate excellence, commitment and a patient-first approach and are praised by their healthcare facilities for delivering high-quality care.



At the heart of our Global Impact framework is our Communities pillar. We strive to make positive, enduring social impacts in our Conexus Communities. This includes giving back to causes close to our employees' hearts, in our office locations, together with our partners' outreach programs and in our healthcare professionals' home countries. In 2024 Conexus employees volunteered over 450 hours of working hours to improve their local communities. Employees supported a wide range of causes including natural disaster cleanup efforts, food banks, mentoring youth and fundraising for good causes. We also launched the new annual Conexus Community Award in recognition of the impact employees make, helping to bridge cultures and creating meaningful opportunities.





MANILA, PHILIPPINES

On December 10 and 11, 2024, the Conexus Experience Team organized a two-day giving activity together with our healthcare professionals living in Manila. We supported two organizations: Bahay Aruga (translated as "House of Care"), which provides care for children undergoing cancer treatment. Bahay Aruga offers shelter to patients and their families whilst they undergo routine cancer treatment at a public hospital in Metro Manila. The second beneficiary is CRIBS Foundation in Antipolo, which houses abandoned babies and vulnerable children who can no longer stay with their families.

The team packed food and nutrition items, art supplies, multivitamins, and hygiene products based on the wish lists provided by the two Foundations and delivered them to support the organizations work.

Florence, a nurse awaiting deployment to the U.S, shared, "This is one of the many reasons why I signed up with Conexus; the company has the heart of giving back."









KIDS MEALS HOUSTON, USA

On September 24, Houston employees gathered in the office to package more than 90 lunches to support Kids' Meals Houston. This local nonprofit, founded in 2006, provides free, healthy meals to children aged 5 and under who don't have access to free schoolbased meals.

The following week, on, October 2, several team members joined in volunteering onsite at Kids' Meals. They delivered the lunches they packaged in the office and helped prepare even more meals for children in need. It was a rewarding experience, and we're proud to support such a vital cause in the greater Houston area.













LANCASHIRE, UK

Eight UK Conexus MedStaff employees volunteered with the Skelmersdale & District Foodbank in April and December 2024.

The Foodbank provides vital emergency support to local people when something unavoidable – such as redundancy, illness or even an unexpected large bill – hits and there's no money to put food on the table. In the last year, they provided 1,929 three-day emergency food supplies to local people in crisis. Nearly 700 of these went to children.

The team donated 24 hours to the organization, shopping, sorting and packing food parcels that will be handed out to the community. In total over 285 essential items and holiday treats were donated.









VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHTS

Leah Gautreaux served as a judge for the Terrebonne Parish School District's 47th Annual Science and Engineering Fair—a role she has taken on 17 times over the past 19 years.

With her medical and teaching background, Leah judged categories ranging from Physics to Biomedical Sciences, mentoring new judges and ensuring the event ran smoothly. "Science fairs show students how to take something they love and turn it into a project they can be proud of," Leah shared.

Leah's dedication stems from her passion for inspiring future scientists and ensuring events like this continue. She recalls a former student who, after reluctantly participating, built a magnetic linear accelerator, gained a newfound love for science, and is now pursuing engineering in college.





In October Brittany Ayon and her son dedicated their Conexus Day of Giving to Renegade Paws Rescue. They helped clean up and make repairs after Hurricane Helene and drove the "Neuter Uber," a van used to transport dogs needing spay or neuter surgeries to volunteer vets. After surgery, these dogs were placed in foster homes for recovery, and Brittany even took two puppies home to care for during their healing process.

For Brittany, helping animals is a deeply personal cause. "These dogs can't help themselves, but the love they give back is incredible," she shares. Her foster dog, once battling cancer, is now healthy, thanks to care and treatment. She's passionate about spay/neuter efforts to prevent overpopulation and reduce the suffering of stray animals.



Conexus team member Kate Andrews took on the Great North Run to raise funds for The Lake District Calvert Trust in the UK. Kate's efforts mark a celebration of Conexus's 10-year partnership with the charity. The Calvert Trust provides life-changing outdoor experiences for children and adults with disabilities, enabling them to safely enjoy activities like canoeing, rock climbing, sailing, and horse riding.

Conexus has proudly supported the Calvert Trust since 2014, sponsoring their annual Outdoor Theatre Event. Kate raised £835 to help the Trust continue to create opportunities for people with complex needs, boosting confidence, improving mental health, and delivering unforgettable experiences.







VOLUNTEER Spotlights

In December Esperanza Modesto used her Conexus Vounteer Hours to join MalaPsychKit's annual Christmas outreach, a program run by Psychology students at Southville International School and Colleges (SISC).

The event brought joy to 110 pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students with toys, food, and Noche Buena packages. SISC's maintenance, engineering, and security staff also received 85 packages, spreading the holiday spirit throughout the community.

For Esperanza, who has volunteered with MalaPsychKit since 2019, the program is close to her heart. "It reminds me that even small acts can mean so much to someone else," she shares.


COMMUNITY AWARD WINNER, UNITED STATES

Monica Ortuno Moya, a registered nurse from Bolivia, is the winner of the first Conexus Healthcare Professional Community Award. The award recognizes exceptional community service and global impact.

In 2024, Monica volunteered with HeartGift, a nonprofit providing life-saving heart surgeries to children in need. Over the past five years, she has supported their medical teams in Bolivia, enabling free surgeries for children without access to advanced care.

Monica, "I am proud to help transform children's lives through surgeries they otherwise couldn't receive." Monica plans to use her prize money to buy gifts for HeartGift beneficiaries and Conexus has made a donation to the organization in her name.

Monica's volunteer history includes Operation Smile missions in Guatemala, Mexico, and Brazil, assisting with cleft condition surgeries. She aspires to advance her career in a Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit, continuing to make a difference.









Monica Eguillion, a professional exam coordinator in our NCLEX team, has been awarded the Employee Conexus Community Award - voted for by our healthcare professionals. She regularly donated her time to community missions in the Philippines as a volunteer medic in the fire and rescue brigade. She supported emergency relief efforts during the pandemic, the Taal Volcano eruption, and natural disasters like Super Typhoon Kristine.

Together with her community and family she provides food, medicines, and school supplies to families who lost their homes. She's being recognised for her work and ingrained philosophy of giving back. Monica is committed to helping others through familydriven projects to build stronger communities. In December 2024, Monica organized a volunteer day for teammates at our Philippines office, delivering food packs to homeless communities during the holidays.




GIFTS FOR GOOD Partnership
